CONGRATULATIONS to our First Holy Communicants:

Congratulations to the thirty pupils in Year 5 who celebrated their First Holy Communion last week in four very special Masses at St Patrick's Church with Father Eamonn. They each looked beautiful, participated with respect and completed their readings with confidence. — they made us all very proud. I thank the parents for supporting their child in their journey of preparation, which I know has taken some time. Thank you to Father Eamonn for always being there to guide and support us and for making sure each Mass was



centred around the children and gave them a very special memory to treasure forever.

















Over the next few weeks our pupils in **Class 4 will begin their journey of preparation** towards making their First Holy Communion in mid- October. We hope this will take place during the week beginning Monday 11th October although specific plans will not be made until we are clear about the restrictions in the Autumn term. Let us hope we are beginning to see life at home and school returning to a more normal position by then.

Class 3 will also be starting their journey of preparation for receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation in the Prayer room at school on Wednesday 14th July. The pupils in Class 4 celebrated the sacrament in this way earlier in the year and it was very successful with Father Eamonn saying how very impressed he was with our pupils.

Many of our **Class 6 pupils have started their journey of preparation** for the sacrament of Confirmation. Miss Smith has been working closely with Father Eamonn to put all the plans in place, to ensure the celebration of the sacrament is a wonderful experience for the pupils who will be celebrating the sacrament with Father Eamonn later in July.

We ask that you keep the all these pupils, who are journeying to develop and deepen their faith, in your thoughts and prayers.

Class Masses in School

It has been wonderful to be able to celebrate class Mass once again in school over the last term. Father Eamonn has led Mass for Class 6, 5, 4 and 3 in school focused around the virtues – helping each of us to become the very best versions of ourselves. It has been lovely to hear the pupils singing to start and finish each Mass (one class only in the hall) – filling the school with the wonderful sounds of joyful singing children, praising and thanking God once again.

Early Years pupils visiting St Patrick's Church:

Yesterday and this coming Thursday, our pupils in the Early Years have or will be visiting St Patrick's Church as part of their RE work in school. They have been learning about the importance of the church, what we can see such as the candles, the altar, our bible, the cross and the tabernacle and finding out why they are important. I was privileged to go with some of the pupils yesterday who thoroughly



enjoyed the visit sharing their knowledge and understanding and learning lots from Father Eamonn. The pupils were a credit to their families and school – very respectful and showing their increasing knowledge and understanding of our faith. We cannot wait to be able to have whole school or Key Stage Masses in church once again where families can be invited to share the special time with us.

Attendance in school:

Since return to school in March the attendance of our pupils has been super in the most part. We understand the challenges and difficulties the year has posed; however, we also know that each

day that a pupil is taken out of school when all other children are in school will have a significant impact on their learning. As I know you will all recognise, we are all working incredibly hard to try to support the pupils in recovering as quickly as possible from the disruption of the last year with additional teachers being employed in each phase of school to provide interventions and catch-up provision as well as the after school catch-up sessions. The governors and I are concerned about the increase in



communication from parents taking their child/ren out of school during this final half term — PLEASE could I ask that you arrange any trips, family gatherings and holidays for during the school holidays as this is having a significant impact on pupils learning during these final weeks and we do not want pupils dropping further behind their peers. We are all ready for some needed family time but with only a few weeks to go, I am sure we can pull together to improve our school attendance once again.
