I cannot believe that we have now arrived at the end of the academic year 2021-2022 and what a successful but challenging year we have had, as a result of the continued impact of the pandemic – let us hope that next year is more straight forward for us all!

#### **Standards and Achievement across school:**


The pupils across school need a huge *congratulations* for all their hard work as they have achieved extremely well in all of the statutory assessment points – EYFS, Y1 (Phonics), end of KS1 assessments, Y4 Multiplication check and end of KS2 SATs.

- EYFS: The progress and achievement of our EYFS pupils with 69% reaching the "Good Level of Development" which is above National averages, Kirklees averages and our Trust averages. Well done to the Reception pupils! BRILLIANT!
- Year 1: The progress and achievement in phonics our Year 1 pupils have made us so proud with 89% passing the phonics check with 32 or more marks out of 40, which is significantly above national averages, Kirklees averages and our Trust averages, even after such a challenging two years of schooling. BRILLIANT!
- End of KS1: The progress and achievement in the end of KS1 assessments our Year 2 pupils have made us so proud with 71.4% reaching the Reading standard for Y2, 63% reaching the Writing standard for Y2 and 69% reaching the maths standard for Y2 which are all above national averages, Kirklees averages and our Trust averages, even after such a challenging three years. BRILLIANT!
- Year 4: The pupils performed brilliantly in the online Multiplication check with the vast majority of pupils achieving at least 20/25 marks there is however no "pass mark" or comparative data but we are very proud of each of them for their hard work and achievements.
- End of KS2: Our Year 6 pupils have made wonderful progress and achieved amazing results as a result of all their hard work 76% reaching National Standard or higher in Reading, with 38% reaching Greater Depth, 71% reaching National Standard or higher in Writing with 15% reaching Greater Depth, 94% reaching National Standard or higher in Maths with 21% reaching Greater Depth and 94% reaching the National Standard or higher in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling with 32% reaching Greater Depth. The progress measures for all subjects were above National and Kirklees averages (we do not have the Trust averages yet) and for Reading and Maths were significantly above. WELL DONE!

I am sure you will all agree that the results for all assessment points are **SUPER** and we say a huge congratulations to the pupils.

Although we have had challenges along the way this year, with COVID outbreaks and even an EYFS closure, the school family have worked in great partnership to ensure we have been able to get through it all as successfully as possible together. Out school led tutoring programme has been a huge success and supported many pupils in achieving their very best.





I wish to thank all our families for their support across this year, together we have been able to ensure our pupils continue with their learning and all pupils make good progress setting them up for their transitions to the next year group. This dedication from yourselves has had a significant benefit to your children and we look forward to working in partnership with you once again in September.

**Boys and Girls**: Green pull-over/cardigan, or the green sweatshirt bearing the school logo.

**Girls** - <u>Tailored</u>, straight legged, charcoal grey trousers, Green skirt, White blouse/polo shirt bearing the school logo

**Boys** - Grey trousers or smart school tailored shorts, White shirt/polo shirt bearing the school logo



**Footwear** - <u>Plain black school shoes</u> or <u>plain black smart trainers</u> with black laces and no flashy logos

**PE Kit:** To be worn on PE days

#### New Mental Health and Wellbeing provision for September 2022

I am very pleased to share with our school community that from September we have been invited to access a new service from Kirklees called the "Mental Health Support Team or MHST". This will allow school to have increased access to additional support and provision on top of the current Catholic Care which we currently purchase. There



are two pathways to the new provision, one for pupils and one for parents of current pupils – Miss Helena Ho is the support worker linked to the pupil provision and Miss Victoria Wade is linked to the parent provision.

There will be a coffee morning at 9:00am on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> September for parents to come to school, enjoy a coffee after drop-off in the morning and meet our Mental Health Support team, who will be explaining more about their roles and the new provision. Over the course of the year, we will be hosting a number of coffee mornings/workshops to offer support and ideas for dealing with a variety of issues such as bed wetting, bedtime routines, food related challenges, dealing with anxiety, parental separation and supporting effective transitions (as well as others not mentioned today). I am sure you will agree this is a very welcomed addition to our current provision and hope you will feel the benefit of it moving forward.
